'Our Voice, Our Vote, Our Future' is a youth consultation that gives 11-18 year olds across Carmarthenshire the chance to have their say on what matters to them.

### Our Voice, Our Vote, Our Future Timeline

School's representatives debate the motions submitted followed by a vote for the top 10 issues.

Convention one - campaign action plan.

#### August 2024

Summer residential - project planning.

Project report completion.

# What Young People told us Our Voice Our Vote Our Future Ballot



"The 2025 'Our Voice, Our Vote, Our Future' ballot revealed that, out of 5221 votes collected, 'Teaching real-life lessons in schools' was the top priority for young people in Carmarthenshire. In response, we created the 'Our Voice: Learn for Life' event."



### Our Voice; Learn Real Life event

The day was packed with opportunities to learn, share, and connect. We invited schools to demonstrate how they're using the curriculum to teach practical, real-life lessons. The attendees had the chance to discuss these approaches and exchange ideas. The event also featured stalls and workshops hosted by public services such as Army Cadets,WCMC, Careers Pathways.... and other organisations offering an interactive and hands-on experience.

"The 'Our Voice: Learn For Life' event brought together young people from ht secondary schools across Carmarthenshire. They participated in activities designed to gather their feedback on their experiences with real-life lessons being taught in schools.



### What life lessons have I learnt in school?

We asked young people to provide us with feedback on what life

lessons they have learnt in school.

### Health and wellbeing

Nutrition, self-care, stress/time management, patience, staying calm under pressure.

### **Personal Growth**

Self-regulation, confidence, perseverance, adaptability, courage, and stepping out of comfort zones.

### Thinking & Learning

Creativity, self-expression, problem-solving, accepting mistakes, curiosity.

### Social & Emotional Skills

Communication, teamwork, kindness, honesty, respect, diversity, and building relationships.

### **Practical Life skills**

First aid, financial management, technology use, public speaking, fire safety, sewing, recycling, and programming.

"I now know how to cook a balanced meal." "I learnt about recycling and how to keep our planet safe!"




"I learnt to fix my own clothes by sewing."


"I learnt about finances for when I leave school."


"I was taught how to deal with my emotions when they get too much."

## **Confidence scale results**


We asked the young people to position themselves on a confidence scale based on how they felt about their real-life learning experiences taught in their educational setting.

# Conclusion

Our Voice: Learn Real Life collected valuable findings on the importance of real life lessons, by showcasing what schools are covering and areas of improvement.

The data collected highlights that young people feel they are being taught life skills such as nutrition, self regulation, confidence, self-expression, diversity, first aid and building positive relationships in schools.

However, the data also illustrates that some areas such as digital skills in future work, social and emotional challenges and dealing with failure need to be further emphasised.
